Ethnicity

The Dail ethnicity debate which accrued from the Oireachtas Justice Committee report on ethnicity was held on June 1st. The Department of Justice, Taoiseach, and Minister for Equality were always very clear to point out that

recognition would not create any new or enhanced benefits for Travellers and that it was largely a symbolic gesture. However, recognition does enhance, in some cases, Travellers protection in legislation and should be a guarantee of future legal inclusion. Both reports of Joint Oireachtas Justice committees note '*that steps be taken to implement any necessary legislative change to reflect recognition*'. The current joint committee was very keen that this issue would remain firmly on the political agenda." **ITM and our members should aim to ensure it is kept on local and national agendas also.**

ITM created a space for members on the 18th May to explore two linked themes:

1. What are the current policy or legislative changes that Ethnicity Recognition currently brings
2. What future changes would ITM members like to see now that Traveller ethnicity has been recognised

A second space for further discussion is being convened at the ITM AGM and ties in with year's theme.

- The development of a strategy
- What we can do now and on an ongoing basis

I, together with the Mercy Law Resource Centre and the Simon Communities in Ireland invite you to our seminar, ***A Right to Housing***.

Our housing sector is in crisis with devastating consequences on the lives of hundreds of thousands of people. We must re-write the rules and fundamentally rethink our approach to housing in Ireland.

At the core of that, acting as an anchor, I believe **we need to enshrine a constitutional right in Bunreacht na hÉireann**. In 2014, 84% of members of the Convention on the Constitution voted in favour of enumerating such a right.

This seminar will bring together key stakeholders to outline the importance of a constitutional right to housing and **to map out the next steps** that could be taken, working collectively, to advance the right to housing from a policy, legislative and constitutional perspective.

Establishment of a National Traveller Mental Health Network

Reminder : There are still some places available to attend this discussion group. If you want your local group/organisation represented please reply at your earliest convenience.

Please note that the 2017 Mental Health Operational Plan that is being rolled out aims to employ 9 mental health coordinators specifically for the Traveller community.

This will inform part of our discussion.

The Traveller Counselling Service would like to invite you to a discussion on the establishment of a National Traveller Mental Health Network.

The aim of this network would be to;

- identify the key issues affecting Travellers mental health
- ensure a co-ordinated response to Travellers needs in terms of mental health
- advocate and lobby on issues relating to Travellers mental health
- support local groups in terms of dealing with mental health

However, on the day, other issues may be brought to the discussion that will become part of the remit of this network.

The rationale behind the setting up of this network, is that mental health is a major issue for Travellers – the situation has in fact been described as a mental health crisis within the community. Feedback from our conference in October 2016, tells us that the Traveller community and the local Traveller organisations are struggling to deal with this mental health crisis with many projects struggling to address these issues at both a local and a national level. This difficulty is in part due to the lack of a co-ordinated response from the various organisations that work to address these. The aim of this network is to ensure that a collective and cohesive response to address mental health is in place. We hope that this discussion will generate the start of this process.

This discussion is open to Travellers and Traveller organisations engaged in addressing mental health issues within the Traveller community. There is a limited number of places available for this event due to venue restrictions (50 max).
